Brenda Addie

Brenda Addie's professional career has involved a long, varied, and international contribution to theatre, film and television as an actor, writer, producer, director and dramaturg. As an actor she has worked with luminaries as such Meryl Streep, Michael York, Richard Todd, Sam Neil, David Jason, Frances de la Tour, Max von Sydow, Terry Scott, Henry McGee and Brendan Gleeson. In Australia, she is remembered for her ongoing television roles in Bellbird, Chances and Neighbours. Amongst her directing credits, she staged and dramaturged six adaptations of the works of James Joyce for *Bloomsday in Melbourne* and premiered Anitra Nelson's *Servant of the Revolution*. Brenda started her music theatre career as Jane in *Salad Days*. Since then, she has played Miss Adelaide (*Guys and Dolls*), Bianca (*Kiss Me Kate*), Amy (*Where's Amy?*), Aldonza (*Man From La Mancha*) and Madame Tetracini (Lilac Time).

Christine Ayres (Choreographer & Irish Dance Consultant)

Christine's career includes choreography for film, concert events and live shows. She has taught Irish dancing for 25 years and is an acclaimed international adjudicator officiating at championships in Ireland, UK, USA, Europe, New Zealand and Australia. Christine's proudest judging appointment to date, has been the invitation to adjudicate the 50th Anniversary of the World championships held in Belfast in 2022. Christine competed for over 20 years and has established her own school, teaching dancers ranging in age from 2 years and upwards of 30 years of age. She has had much success with dancers winning State, National and the World championship titles. She is incredibly honoured to be the choreographer for Castle Gillian.

Liam Ayres

Liam began Irish dancing at the age of 5 in his hometown of Melbourne, Australia. Under the tuition of his uncle, Raymond and aunty, Christine Ayres, he won 7 Victorian and 2 Australian solo titles as well as placing 3rd at the 2003 World Championships in Ireland. He was an original troupe member of the Irish dancing show Dance of Desire before being offered a position with Riverdance. As principal dancer, he led companies in Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, South America and throughout Australia & New Zealand, performing on prestigious stages including the Kremlin Palace in Moscow, the Pantages Theatre in Hollywood and Radio City Music Hall in New York. Additional Irish dancing credits include Please Like Me (ABC) and the Melbourne International Comedy Festival. Liam is a qualified I rish dancing teacher (TCRG) with the Christine Ayres School and an adjudicator (ADCRG), selected to judge competitions worldwide.

Kim Bishop (Costume Design)

Kim was nominated for a Green Room Award for his costume design on *The Light In The Piazza* (Life Like Company). His most recent design work includes *The Wedding Singer* (David Venn Enterprises) Australia, New Zealand tour and *Sweeney Todd* starring Anthony Warlow and Gina Riley. Other costume design work includes *The 39 Steps* and *They're Playing Our Song* (HIT Productions, National tours), *Jesus Christ Superstar*, *Singin' In The Rain*, *The Producers*, *Kismet*, *The King & I*, *The Boyfriend*, *Crazy For You*, *Mame*, *Damn Yankees*, *42nd Street*, *Sweet Charity* and *The Boy From Oz* with Todd McKenney (The Production Company).

He has toured as Head of Wardrobe on many large-scale musicals including *The King & I*, *Joseph and The Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat*, *South Pacific*, *The Rocky Horror Show*, *Aida – The Spectacular*, *Singin' in The Rain*, *Shout*, *Moonshadow*, *One Man Two Guvnors*, *The Boy From Oz* and *Dusty*. He has dressed on *Grease*, *Cats*, *Sugar Babies*, *A Little Night Music*, *Shane Warne – The Musical*, for Opera Australia and The Australian Ballet. For several years, Kim had the pleasure of touring the world as Wardrobe Manager with Torvill & Dean and their international ice-skating companies.

Zak Brown

Zak has performed for Music Theatre Melbourne (MTM) as Aenaes in the original staging of Paris. He has also appeared in many Musicals, Operas and Concerts around Melbourne. Some of his favourite roles include Don Quixote in *Man of La Mancha*, Molokov in *Chess*, John Wilkes Booth in *Assassins* and Javert in *Les Miserables*.

Kieran competed from a young age in State, National and World Irish Dancing Championships. He gained numerous State and National titles in solo and ceili sections and was also runner-up throughout his career at numerous championships. A highlight of his competitive career was achieving a top ten position at the World Championships in Dublin 2011. Kieran has also performed professionally, including being part of the original cast of 'Celtic Illusion' in 2011, and performing with Daniel O'Donnell during the Melbourne leg of his 2017 Australian tour. Kieran is a qualified Irish Dancing teacher, having passed his teaching exam in 2013 and currently teaches with the world renowned Christine Ayres School of Irish Dancing in Melbourne, Australia.

Richard Jeziorny (Scenic Design Consultant)

NIDA trained set and costume designer currently resident on the Central Coast of NSW. Richard has designed over 300 projects encompassing drama, opera, dance, musical theatre, large scale puppetry, circus and outdoor and indoor events. In Melbourne he was a resident designer at the MTC and at St Martins. He designed 16 projects for the Production Company including South Pacific, Oklahoma, Camelot, Follies, Kiss Me Kate, Singing in the Rain and Sunset Boulevard. He has also designed productions in China, Malaysia and Indonesia.

Victor Kazan (Book & Lyrics)

Victor Kazan has worked in the entertainment industry for more than half a century - in theatre, radio, film and television. Bom and educated in London, he studied Romance Languages at university before attending the Webber-Douglas Academy of Dramatic Art. After gaining professional acting experience in repertory, he turned to directing and was soon being hired by commercial theatre producers. Over the next decade he travelled extensively in the UK, Europe, Canada, Africa, Australia and New Zealand, directing a wide variety of productions - from the farce *Two and Two Make Sex* to the thriller *Deathtrap*; from Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet* to Pirandello's *Six Characters in Search of an Author*—and it was during this period that he began his writing career.

In the early 1980s he took up residence in Australia, working as an actor and voice-over artist. Over the next few years, he appeared in the movies Kangaroo, A Slice of Life, Sky Pirates, A Shifting Dreaming and Every Move She Makes, as well as playing major roles in the mini-series Eureka Stockade, Waterfront, The Petrov Affair and Black Boomerang. During this same period, he continued to be offered directing engagements, helming critically-acclaimed productions such as the hit comedy *Funny Peculiar*, the musical *Blues in the Night* and Mozart's opera *The Magic Flute*. Musical Theatre has been an important part of Victor's life ever since the age of eight, when he was cast in the role of Little Jake in an amateur production of *Annie Get Your Gun*. Twenty years later he would write the lyrics for his first musical *A Little Bit of Fluff*.

His film and TV writing credits include Requiem for a Wren, The Madness That Was Kolberg, Stoker's Boat, Hit the Ground Running and Dalkeith. For the stage, he wrote the revue Rome & All That Jazz and the trilogy A Question of Identity; and with his long-time collaborator, Kevin Purcell, he created the musicals *Rebecca* and *The Stranger from Seville*. www.kazanandpurcell.com

Kevin Purcell (Composer)

Kevin has served as a musical director and conductor for opera, classical music and musical theatre for over 35 years in the USA, Europe and Australia. He holds two doctoral degrees in Theatre and Music respectively. Kevin is also the Music Director and Principal Conductor of the Australian Discovery Orchestra; the country's most innovative professional symphony orchestra (www.australiandiscoveryorchestra.com). As a musical director, Kevin has previously been the musical director of the original production of *CATS* (1995-96) at the New London Theatre as well as for the South Korean Premiere production (2003). More recently Kevin has conducted *WICKED* at London's Apollo Victoria theatre and was the originating musical director for the first national UK/Eire tour (2013).

As an arranger and orchestrator, Kevin is much sought after for his American Songbook orchestrations. His arrangements have been performed by leading orchestras including the National Symphony Orchestra (Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts), New York City Opera, New York Pops, Boston Pops and by artists including, Marvin Hamlisch, Stephen Schwartz, Kristin Chenoweth, Liz and Ann Hampton Callaway, Raúl Esparza, Victor Garber, Stephen Flaherty and Lynn Ahrens, and numerous other A-list Broadway artists.

As a composer of musical theatre, in collaboration with Victor Kazan (Book & Lyrics), Kevin has scored three musicals to date: *Rebecca* (2004), *The Stranger from Seville* (2013 New York Music Theatre Festival Grand Jury Selection; 2018 2nd. Florida Festival of New Musicals) and Castle Gillian (2022). Kevin originally studied conducting at the Moscow Conservatory (USSR) with subsequent graduate conducting studies at the Janáček Academy of Music (CZ) culminating in a Master degree in orchestral conducting at Bard College (USA). Awards include: GOI-IES Scholarship (Ireland, 2021); Australian Music Foundation in London Sir Charles Mackerras Conductor Prize (1994 & 1995); Tait Memorial Trust Award (London 1996); Opera Australia Willem van Otterloo Scholarship (1993) and Bellhouse Conducting Prize (1993).

Michael Ralph (Choreography)
